


How to host a Community Saints Bookclub

Turn your love of reading into an act of giving this Christmas.

We've broken it down to simple steps to help guide you!

Step 1 - Gather your Club

Invite your regular bookclub friends (or start a new one) and set a date for your Saintly Bookclub in November or December.



Step 2 - Spread the word

Let everyone know your bookclub will be supporting St Bart's this Christmas.

Instead of bringing food or wine, each person makes a digital donation through the Be a Saint for St Bart's online shop.

Visit our digital hamper shop and choose a virtual gift or hamper to add to the total.

Step 3 – Make it Meaningful

Add a touch of Christmas to your gathering – fairy lights, candles, or a simple blue ribbon to show your support. Begin the evening with a short reflection about generosity, dignity, or community.

If you let us know you will be hosting we can even post you some badges for your saintly guests.

Option - Read, Reflect & Give

Choose a book that inspires connection and compassion.

During your discussion, reflect on how small acts of kindness – like your group's collective donations – can create big change.



Step 6 – Share and Inspire

Take a group photo (without branded items or alcohol, please) and share your experience to inspire others to become Community Saints.
